





Conditions Report

No respiratory irritation associated with *Karenia brevis* (commonly known as red tide) is expected in this region.

**Due to the upcoming federal holiday, the next bulletin will be issued on Tuesday, January 19. **


Recent ensemble imagery (VIIRS, 1/8) is partially obscured by clouds from Sabine Pass to East Matagorda Bay, limiting analysis of that region. Elevated chlorophyll (2-5 $\mu\text{g/L}$) is present along the Texas coast from Matagorda Bay to the Padre Island National Seashore; however, none of these regions contain the optical characteristics of *K. brevis*. Elevated chlorophyll in this region is most likely due to the resuspension of benthic chlorophyll and sediments along the coast.



Wind speed and direction are averaged over 12 hours from buoy measurements. Length of line indicates speed; angle indicates direction. Red indicates that the wind direction favors upwelling near the coast. Values to the left of the vertical line are measured values; values to the right are forecasts. Wind observation and forecast data provided by NOAA's National Weather Service (NWS).
